### TRAFFIC SIGNALS @ KILL CREEK & 83RD ST

Contractors installed a new traffic controller box at the Kill Creek & 83rd intersection! This device allowed us to make necessary customizations to the traffic signals, like...

- Adding a flashing yellow light when turning onto Kill Creek, after the eastbound 83rd traffic gets the green light
- Programming custom timing during peak traffic hours
- Having working video detection for all approaches to the intersection, meaning signals are responsive to upcoming cars rather than be solely timer dependent.



This signal is planned to stay up until the work on K-10 is complete, which will continue throughout 2023.
